



Glenn Linn Shows Off Outerwear - In The Post Star Holiday Parade!

For the second consecutive year, the Shire of Glenn Linn was proud to participate in the 2015 Post-Star Holiday Parade, in support of the Memorial Detachment No. 2 of the Marine Corps League "Toys For Tots" and the Tri-County United Way "Live United" program. These two groups distribute donated new toys and non-perishable food items to local families in Warren, Washington and northern Saratoga counties.

In addition to featuring "you know 'who'" (the modern day version of Sinterklaas), the parade, of course, showcased our shire and graciously included more than 110 other entries that represent our area's culture. Among those who joined us were community groups, bands, floats, costumed characters, and marchers such as our reenactor friends of later time periods like the French & Indian War and the American Revolution.





"Sinterklaas": Where It All Began, Maybe.

The Tale of Sinterklaas and Swarte Piet

Where does Santa Claus come from? The North Pole, of course. But before that jolly old elf was "Sinterklaas," a mythical personna from the Benelux (Belguim, Netherlands, Luxembourg) region of Europe. Depicted as an elderly, serious man with white hair and a long, full beard, Sinterclaas traditionally wears a red and white bishop's outfit, rides a white horse, and carries a big, red book in which is written whether each child has been good or naughty during the year past.

Sinterklaas himself may be somewhat based on a real person called "Sint Nicholaas" (Saint Nicholas) who was born in the modern country of Turkey, and lived from 270-342 C.E., first in Holland and later in Spain. According to researchers, stories about his life helped form today's Christmas traditions, especially that of Santa Claus. As a young adult, he became a Greek bishop in the early Christian Church, and, even during his own lifetime, became widely beloved by children for his kindness and anonymous gifts of money.

After his death at age 72, Nicholas became recognized by the Church as the patron saint of children everywhere and, especially in Spain, of sailors. The date he died, 6 December, was named Saint Nicholas Day, an official day of feast. The stories of the man grew into myth and legend. Some say, each year, on the evening before feast day, the spirit of Saint Nicholas would quietly enter the rooms of good little boys and girls while they slept, and reward them by leaving money in their shoes, or candy or gifts in their stockings.

But, it was also widely accepted that not all little boys and girls deserved such presents...so, sometime during the 11th century, the stories added mischievous sidekicks. The most well known was "Swarte Piet" (or, "Black Pete"), often depicted as being from the country of Morroco or as a page whose face and hands were blackened by chimney soot. The purpose of this slightly devilish assistant was to carry a bag containing candy for nice children, and a chimney sweep's broom for spanking the naughty. Sometimes, Sinterklaas would leave a note that Swarte Piet had hidden their presents in a burlap somewhere in the house. And, sometimes those who had misbehaved would discover that their stockings held only a few lumps of coal.

Then again, according to some folklorists, the origin of Sinterklaas can be found in the early Germanic tales of Woden and the Wild Hunt. In these stories, Woden, a major deity of ancient Anglo-Saxon culture, rode a white horse that flew through the air. He was accompanied by black ravens that informed him of the good and bad behavior of the mortals. While this older "Germanic" theory has little support among present-day scholars, it seems clear that the Sinterklaas tradition, and that of today's Santa Claus, do contain a number of elements not ecclesiastical in origin.

OYLE SOPPES (from the Harleian MS 4016)

An Authentic recipe for Onion-ale soup served over bread from 15th century England.

"Take a good quantite of onyons, and myce hem, noyt to smale, & seth hem in faire water, And take hem vppe; and then take a good quantite of stale ale, as .iij. galons, And there-to take a pynte of goode oyle that is fraied, and cast the onyons there-to, And lete al boyle togidre a grete wile; and caste there-to Saffron and salt, And ben put brede, in maner of brewes, and cast the licour there-on, and serue hit forth hote." - Austin, Thomas.

Two Fifteenth-Century Cookery-Books. Harleian MS. 279 & Harl. MS. 4016, with extracts from Ashmole MS. 1429, Laud MS. 553, & Douce MS 55. London: for The Early English Text Society by N. Trübner & Co., 1888.

Translation: Take a good quantity of onions, and mince them, not too small, & boil them in fair water, And take them up; and then take a good quantity of stale ale, as 3 gallons, And there-to take a pint of good oil that is fried, and cast the onions there-to, And let all boil together a great while; and cast there-to Saffron & salt, And then put bread, in manner of brews, and cast the liquid there-on, and serve it forth hot.

Ingredients:

Onions, cut in medium-sized pieces.

Ale - this should be flat (stale).

Oil

 ${\sf Saffron}$

Salt

Day-old bread slices

Directions: Boil the onions until only partially cooked; remove from the water and allow to completely dry. When dry, fry the onions in hot oil until completely cooked through; remove from oil. In a large soup pot, combine ale, onions, saffron, & salt to taste. Bring to a boil, then reduce heat to simmer and continue to cook for approx. 15 minutes to ½ hour. Cut the bread slices (sans crust) into small strips or squares; place these in the bottom of your serving bowl or in individual soup bowls. Ladle the hot soup over the bread, then serve it forth!

CURRANTS PIE (A dessert for six gentles)

Unedited from "The Hobbit Cookbook," by S. A. Martel. Any "mistakes" are exactly as printed in the original cook book.

Preparation time: 10 minutes; Cooking time: 45 min

Ingredients:

500g / 2 cups flour

150g / oz butter

1 egg

1 pinch of salt

 $125g / \frac{1}{2}$ cup water

4 eggs

sugar

500g / 1 lb currants

Directions:

For the crust:

Warm the oven on 350F/180C


Make a pastry with mixing flour, butter, salt, water and egg. Spread the pastry with a roll and set it on a baking pan, then cover with a baking paper and top with dried vegetables.

Cook for 35 mn and remove the dried vegetables and the paper.

For the filling:

3 eggs weigh, and add the same weight of sugar and red currants. Mix the egg yolks and suggar. Add the beaten egg whites until stiff, then currants.

Spread the mixture on the dough almost cooked and cook 10 minutes.



Back in 1992 I wrote an article designed to help individuals new to this hobby make informed choices about the sources they used for doing research. While much has changed, with the internet probably becoming the most frequently used reference source, much can still be said for doing research the old fashioned way. To that end, I present a revised version of this ancient document.

This article is designed to provide, in my opinion only, suggestions and comments upon various sources of information and their value as research tools for individuals new to the study of the subject covered. Individuals who may already have a good understanding of a particular subject will, one would hope, have a good grasp of the merits of any given text they may utilize. Such is likely not the case for those individuals who are new to a subject. And so, with that being said, it is to the new students that my remarks are aimed because it is always better to learn something correctly at first, than to try and correct misconceptions later on.

Books for Beginners to Use

When you begin studying a new topic, I would invariably advise that you conduct your search in a way that allows you to begin learning a broad base of new information, and to then build on this foundation by progressing through the type of study aids available in a orderly fashion. This progression should normally take you through the three types of text I feel are invaluable to the student of a new topic: Introductory Books, Overview Books, and Secondary Texts.

Introductory books are by necessity very basic, yet full of information. They tend to introduce you to the most prominent aspects of their topic, with information included on the peripheral development of these topics. Of course, these books vary in nature but generally are designed to "spark" your interest than provide hard facts about a subject. I recommend starting with this type of book less for what they may provide the reader, and more for the fact that they can be used to lead into more complete studies of the topic they cover. A good examples of this type of book are the DK (Dorling Kindersley) "Eyewitness" series normally found in the young reader section of the book store. These books provide a very broad overview of the subject matter and usually have many illustrations that can provide inspiration for research and projects.







The next step beyond introductory books are what I call Overview Books. This type of text is designed to provide you with as much information about the topic covered as possible in the space that they have. These books tend to be information heavy and footnote light. Meaning, while much information is provided, there will probably not be a lot of discussion about how and why things happened as they did when they did. These books will however generally provide you with a good idea of most of the things you would want to know about a given subject.

These books are generally produced as part of a series, with each book in the series covering a specific topic. Some good ones include "The Emergence of Man," and "Timeframe" books from Time-Life, the "Men-At-Arms" books by Osprey and the more meaty "Everyday Life..." books from Dorset Press.











Last but not least are the secondary texts. These books are for the big kids so be prepared to be...bored. Of course I kid. These books are generally comprised of extensive research, done by the author into primary sources such as historic documents, archaeological site reports and other academic papers. They then sift through all of the data and produce a coherent overview of a particular topic. Expect a secondary text to be jam-packed with information elaborated upon down to the smallest detail. Be warned however, these books tend to make dry reading, and, in some cases, will have more footnotes on a page than text. They also tend to be fairly expensive but, can be had for free (for a period) through your local library or on inter-library loan. The Archaeologia Mundi series falls into this category as does a plethora of other scholarly texts. Some publishers, such as Thames & Hudson are well respected for these types of texts. Barns & Noble will often have dated reprints in the \$5 to \$10 section of the store as well.

A FLING WITH FRANCISCA

The Shire of Glenn Linn, has, to my understanding, a rather well established archery program and takes pride in the accomplishments of its archers. Recently, the shire has also become lucky enough to also host thrown weapon practices in conjunction with its long standing archery program. Both the shires archery Marshal (Lord Tomas an Bhogha O Neill) and new Thrown Weapon Marshal (Lady Serafina Della Torre) should be both commended and thanked for their efforts.

In honor of the shire's newly launched exploration of the throwing arts I felt it would be appropriate to write an article celebrating one of the most interesting, unusual and perhaps effective throwing weapons of the early period: The Francisca.

Named after the Franks, a middle migration period Germanic tribal federation, for whom it was a ubiquitous national weapon, this interestingly shaped throwing ax was also adopted by neighboring groups such as the Alamani and the Saxons. Known to have been in use throughout both the Merovingian and Carolingian periods (roughly 500-814 CE), the historian Procopius (c. 500-565) mentioned its use in this way:

"...each man carried a sword and shield and an axe. Now the iron head of this weapon was thick and exceedingly sharp on both sides while the wooden handle was very short. And they are accustomed always to throw these axes at one signal in the first charge and thus shatter the shields of the enemy and kill the men."

The francisca is generally characterized by a distinctly arch-shaped, upswept head that widens at the cutting edge and terminates a distinct point at both the upper and lower corners. The top of the head is usually either S-shaped or convex with the lower portion curving inward and forming wider angle with short wooden haft. Measurements of recovered heads and work



down with modern replicas would indicate a four inch cutting head, a six inch length from edge to back of socket, a head weight of around one to one and one half pounds and a haft length around sixteen inches.

Apparently designed specifically for throwing, the weight of the head and length of the haft would allow the axe to be thrown with considerable momentum and accuracy out to around fifty feet. The shape of the head also provides several advantages when thrown. Because of the acute point at the top of the blade that rises higher than the handle, the francisca will still strike and penetrate if over rotated on the throw (with the handle forming more of a right angle to the target) and because of the bladed rounded contour, it will be more likely to stick or cut if under rotated on the throw (so that the handle and the edge are

parallel to the target.) Finally, even if the edge or point of the blade were not to strike the target, the hefty weight of the iron head could still easily cause injury.

The francisca's most practical application in combat however, may have been more psychological than physically harmful. Procopius makes it clear that in combat, the Frankish lines would be signaled to throw their franciscas at enemy formations immediately before hand to hand combat (frequently done before an all-out infantry charge), with the purpose of breaking shields, disrupting the enemy line and possibly wounding or killing an enemy warrior. Of course, during this period, heavy and ridged armor, normally effective against these types of weapons, was generally very limited in availability and while a shield could likely deflect the francisca, its design and allowed for some interesting results when such happened. Modern tests have shown that the heavy head and comparatively long haft combine to make weapon ricochet off of the ground or other objects in any random direction and hurl about unpredictably.

In a situation where a large group of Franks attacked a formation, the initial volley, some striking and wounding, some shattering shields and perhaps most bouncing around among the enemy, causing confusion and perhaps additional damage, would likely not only cause confusion but disrupt the formation, giving the Franks an edge when they followed up the throw with a fast charge and hand to hand fighting. Therefore, while eminently suited for throwing at targets due to its blade shape and design, the francisca's true calling is in depriving an enemy of their formation, which would well suit a troop type which hopes to charge straight into the enemy formation, and hack it up from inside, as was common among the various tribal warbands of the period.
