<u>First event tips:</u> I would like to share some of the acquired knowledge from that weekend with all of the newcomers reading this now, since some of it was never said to me.

First and most importantly Tunic/Dress/Garb materials and color choices are very important. July 4th weekend is always hot and usually mostly sunny. With that in mind, Black is not a good choice for your first tunic. Nor is only having one tunic to wear for the entire event. Brighter and lighter colors (not Neon) are best as they will not absorb the sun's heat as much during the day. Material choices is also important, try to stay away from polyester, and stick with cottons, cotton blends, some microfibers and even though it is a little more expensive Linen is the absolute best. Men's lounge pants (the ones that don't have elastic around the ankles) are a great way to have pants and not have to make your own right off the bat and most solids and patterned (stripes, flannel-look) are period as well. For women some basic skirts also work in a pinch with a frilly blouse. Also you should bring more than one tunic/dress even if day tripping, you just never know what may happen.

Second, hydration is a definite must. Lots and lots of water as well as something with electrolytes in it like watered down Gatorade. It is suggested that you drink at least 64 ounces (half a gallon) of clear water each day and even more than that during the summer. I know that Poland Springs makes a 2.5 gallon water jug and some other companies may offer the same. All most every event site has potable water as well, so you can bring empty jugs or refill your water jug when needed. If you buy the containers of Kool-Aid, powdered teas, Gatorade, lemonade or other powdered drink mixes you can make them in one of your jugs and just use half the amount of the mix so you get more out of it and it helps you stay hydrated. For those of us that are of the legal drinking age, alcohol is tempting but it is not a suggestion for keeping you hydrated. Remember to have a cup, mug or water bottle on hand at all times as you can always find a way to refill and drink just about anywhere on site.

Third you should remember to find shade and use sunscreen as often as possible. We all know that sunburns suck and can ruin your weekend if you get a really bad one right off the bat. Not to mention that sun stroke/heat stroke can also make your weekend be a disaster as well. Many of the events in the SCA have shaded areas with activities going on and some individual groups have a common area with shade and this makes for a good way to meet new people. Trees, Pavilions, EZ-Ups/Canopies and car ports are all ways to find or make your own shade and can be inviting to others who may want to get out of the sun for a bit as well.

My fourth suggestion is that you should always ask questions if you have them. Most SCAdians are more than willing to talk to you, give you the answers to your questions, point you to someone with more knowledge of the question you asked and even show you the answers. You only need to ask. If you can find Master Liam St. Liam at an event he is a wealth of knowledge about many SCA related topics and can give you a brief tour (or even an elaborate one) if you ask him.

This brings me to the fifth topic that has always come up and has been asked by many newcomers, "What do I eat for food while at the event?" I even asked for suggestions on this topic before my first event and here are some of the things that were said. No matter if you are day tripping or staying for the entire event you can eat just about anything you want as long as you have a way to prepare it. Some basics though are always the simplest things like: Peanut Butter & Jelly, Loaf of Bread, Hot Dogs, Ramen, Spaghetti, Pierogis, Potato Pancakes, Silver Dollar Pancakes, Fresh Fruits, S'mores Items, Beef Jerky and Canned Stews. Some of these you can even prepare ahead of time and just warm it up on a camp stove or in a fire pit especially the Spaghetti, just boil it at home, drain it and bag it then warm it up and add the sauce on site. Snacks are always a good thing and almost everyone love S'mores which can be a way to meet the others around you if you offer some to them. Tetsu and I discovered that if you add some of the beef jerky to your ramen while it is boiling it adds more flavor to the noodles and softens the jerky so it is easier to chew. Pretty much anything you can prepare ahead of time and bring with you to warm up, even freeze and let it thaw in your cooler as the event passes can be made so use your cooking skills to your advantage. Some groups even offer meal plans for the event and others may see you walking by and ask if you would like to join them. Some events, like NRWC this year, have food vendors on site that you can purchase a meal at their booth. It's a good to have a plate, bowl, cup/mug and eating utensils with you so you can eat what you bring or if offered to join someone these items can be your "feast kit".

Just remember to make time for yourself even with everything going on and enjoy the event you attend. You don't want to burn out in one day, nor do you want to feel like you didn't get to do anything. You probably won't be able to do everything an event has to offer, so it's best to look at the event's schedule and plan out your time there with friends, family and for vourself.

When you have the opportunity, be sure to stop by my tent for a chat. I'd love to meet you. When it's all said and done, I think you'll be glad you came to NRWC.
